GET INFO ABOUT PROTOCOLS, PROCEDURES, GUIDELINES AND MORE!

COUNCIL INTERNATIONAL EVENT GUIDELINE

If your council is planning to host international Scouts as participants at a local council event, the International Department will work with your event registrar to verify that contingent leaders and International Service Team (IST/staff) members are registered and approved by their own WOSM Scout association to attend your event.

This may seem like an unnecessary step in your event planning, but it can be crucial to your event's success. At a previous large-council event, only 85 percent of the contingent leaders and 78 percent of the IST that applied were approved by their Scout association. Contact the International Department at International@scouting.org to verify the registration and approval of your international Scouts.

WORLD SCOUT EMBLEM USAGE

Although the BSA is a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), BSA members cannot use the World Scout emblem or World Scout banner without consulting the WOSM Scout Brand Manual and, in some cases, without obtaining the appropriate license. Read World Scout Emblem Usage to be sure you are using these trademarked symbols appropriately. Resources are also available on the International Department website.

JamCam Venue Fun Facts!

The Iguaçu (Water)Falls

The Iguaçu Falls are waterfalls of the Iguaçu River on the border of the Argentine province of Misiones and the Brazilian state of Paraná. Together, they make up the largest waterfall system in the world.

The Itaipu Hydroelectric Dam

The name "Itaipu" was taken from an isle that existed near the construction site. In the Guarani language, Itaipu means "the sounding stone." The Itaipu Dam's hydroelectric power plant has produced the most energy of any in the world as of 2016.

EUROPEAN JAMBOREE 2020

Eurojam Venue Fun Facts!

According to the EuroJam website at: https://ej2020.org, Sobieszewo is a unique district of the city of Gdańsk, surrounded by the Śmiała Wisła river on the west, the Martwa Wisła river on the south, the Przekop Wisły on the east (all of these being branches of the Vistula or Wisla (Polish) River, Poland's longest river) and to top it all, the Bay of Gdańsk on the Baltic Sea on the north. The island is a part of the Mierzeja Wiślana.

The woods and the beaches of Sobieszewo Island

Sobieszewo Island is an area of about $35~\rm km^2$ with more than 1,000 ha of woods. The beach, 11 km long, is the longest one in Gdańsk. It includes two guarded bathing areas—in Sobieszewo and in Orlinki.

On the island there are two nature reserves: Ptasi Raj (Birds' Paradise) on the western end of Śmiała Wisła, and Mewia Łacha (Seagull Dune) on the east, near Przekop Wisły.

As an act of recognition of Sobieszewo Island's natural beauty and unique value, the area has been granted the status of a legally protected nature park.
