On Sunday, February 25, we celebrated the highest awards in Girl Scouting at the Rialto Center for the Arts. 93 Girl Scouts were awarded the Gold Award and 6 were recognized as Council Young Women of Distinction. Gold Awardees were asked to create a sustainable and measurable Take Action project. The goal of these projects is to provide meaningful, long-term solutions for local and global communities. The road to completing the Gold Award is not easy and begins with the Bronze and Silver Awards. This year, 556 Girl Scouts earned their Silver Award and 969 earned their Bronze Award. These extraordinary young women are highlighted in this year's Gold Award yearbook. Although April has been slow to reveal Spring weather in the Northeastern United States, I had the opportunity to experience almost summer like weather April 11-15 at the Summit Bechtel Reserve outside Beckley, West Virginia. My visit to the Summit was to take part in the first Head of Contingents meeting for the 2019 World Scout Jamboree, where I was pleased to represent your IFSR as well as serve in my capacity as chairman of the 2019 Base and Subcamp Operations team. AJ Block, a recipient of both the Cliff Dochterman and Silver Wheel Award, joined me as we mixed and mingled with Scouters, many of them Rotarians, from over 50 countries. I am happy to report we will be able to schedule a Rotary meeting at the Jamboree, but we are still awaiting approval on a display booth. Space at the Summit will be at a premium in 2019, as we expect over 50,000 participants and staff, and the event is already SOLD OUT, with many National Scout Organizations on the waitlist to increase their numbers. The Contingent Management Teams from around the world will be sharing 2 large tents rather than being issued individual tents, due to the aforementioned space constraints. We'll keep you posted about the Jamboree as we get closer to the July 22 - August 2, 2019 dates.

INTERNATIONAL EAGLE PROJECT SUPPORTED BY ROTARY



STEPHENS CITY — Bryce Williams, 15, of Stephens City recently achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. A student at Sherando High School, he is the son of Stuart and Jennifer Williams. Bryce is a member of Troop 15, which meets at Stephens City United Methodist Church. For his Eagle Scout project, Bryce took the lead on an international project to help bring educational supplies to children in Negril, Jamaica.

Bryce managed and coordinated efforts between his Boy Scout troop, the Rotary Club of Winchester, the Strasburg Rotary Club, The Winchester Star, the Negril Rotary, the Negril Environmental Education Trust and the World Scouting Organization. He collected, shipped, and delivered more than 2,200 educational supplies (right photo) to three schools in Negril. During the trip, Bryce — with help from his twin sister McKenna and his younger sister Addison — spoke to and tutored students at the three schools, help run an international scout troop meeting, Served in a soup kitchen line, and participated in an international Rotary meeting. This project included more than 400 service hours over an eight-month period.

The IFSR is dedicated to Service to Youth, and in particular to service to Scout and Guide units. Rotarians have found many ways to serve Scout and Guide units, and they can receive the IFSR Youth Service Award for serving a Scout or Guide unit and having it mentioned in the media, any media outlet.

The IFSR Youth Service Award may be awarded to any Rotary Club that renders service in support of Scout and/or Guide units which is publicized in the media, any media. The IFSR Webmaster may give the awards to a club annually. Recipients are selected from articles posted in media or online. Such articles may be brought to the attention of the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us].

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award and is intended to reward Rotary Clubs who support local Scout and/or Guide Units and have their support publicized in the media or online.

To ensure that the award is available worldwide in a timely manner, it is only distributed electronically. The recipient club will be notified of the award and given instructions on how to download and print the certificate. The award can be downloaded and printed by the club themselves or at a print center.

It is hoped that the example provided by the clubs earning these awards will serve as an example on how Rotary Clubs can become more involved in service to youth and in particular to Scout and Guide units. Hopefully these Rotarians will become more aware of the IFSR and the services it provides to Rotarians in their support of Scout and Guide units. Today, Scouts of all kinds use the camp on weekends when school is in session while special needs organizations and Scouts with disabilities have exclusive run of the wheelchair-accessible facilities for free all summer.

Madison Rotary Club, March 13, 2018, Tap Into Madison. (award)

End Hunger 3, hosted by the Rotary Club of Madison, had the goal this year, the event's third, to package 200,000 meals for hungry New Jerseyans throughout Rotary district 7470, which encompasses Morris, Essex, Sussex, Warren and Hunterdon counties, as well as parts of Somerset County. An estimated 600 people showed up including members of more than two dozen Rotary clubs throughout the region.

Marion Noontime Rotary Club (IL), March 9, 2018, Marion Republican. (award)

Recently, the Marion Noontime Rotary Club promised \$10,000, and now, Heartland Regional Medical Center has signed on as the "named" partner, pledging a \$100,000 donation for what will be called the "Heartland Regional Medical Center Inclusive Playground." This playground at Ray Fosse Park offers more opportunities for children (and adults) of diverse abilities.

Malvern Rotary Club (OH), Feb. 18, 2018. The Review. (award)

The monies were raised at their Field of Honor flag display held at the Malvern United Methodist Church.
