LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT PDG MARK KRIEBEL



IFSR YOUTH SERVICES AWARDS

The IFSR is dedicated to Service to Youth, and in particular to service to Scout and Guide units. Rotarians have found many ways to serve Scout and Guide units, and they can receive the IFSR Youth Service Award for serving a Scout or Guide unit and having it mentioned in the media, any media outlet.

The IFSR Youth Service Award may be awarded to any Rotary Club that renders service in support of Scout and/or Guide units which is publicized in the media, any media. The IFSR Webmaster may give the awards to a club annually. Recipients are selected from articles posted in media or online. Such articles may be brought to the attention of the IFSR webmaster [webmaster@scouters.us].

This is not a Scouting award nor a Rotary award, but an IFSR award and is intended to reward Rotary Clubs who support local Scout and/or Guide Units and have their support publicized in the media or online.

To ensure that the award is available worldwide in a timely manner, it is only distributed electronically. The recipient club will be notified of the award and given instructions on how to download and print the certificate. The award can be downloaded and printed by the club themselves or at a print center.

It is hoped that the example provided by the clubs earning these awards will serve as an example on how Rotary Clubs can become more involved in service to youth and in particular to Scout and Guide units. Hopefully these Rotarians will become more aware of the IFSR and the services it provides to Rotarians in their support of Scout and Guide units. Gaborone Rotary Club (Botswana); February 23, 2019; IFSR Website. (award)



"Rotarian friends, old and new, were blessings throughout, helping us in Scotland and Texas as we struggled to deal with countless details, navigating the rules of two governments, always focused on bringing Jack home. It was with the help of Rotarians that Jack was properly cared for at each end of the road. It was Rotarians who made sure we never felt alone or "far from home" in Scotland, and it was Rotarians in Austin who not only helped us in planning the service, but it was the local District Governor, and Episcopal minister, who officiated. Our Faith, and our Rotary beliefs blended beautifully in our final farewell to Jack.

In our hearts. This is a personal, handwritten note – or a long phone call in which we've been able to talk, and share fond memories of Jack and his wonderful life...his laughter, and the joy he took in everything. Please forgive my typing this as I (Kathleen) recognize even if my penmanship were readable, my hands are not yet steady enough to begin writing to each and every one of the amazing people my parents have brought in to our lives. They say it takes a village. My response? I am grateful for the village my parents chose to raise me in, and for the people in it – thank you for being one of them, and for holding our family in your hearts. Signed Kathleen and Nita Louise

John B. "Jack" Mayo, Jr passed away unexpectedly in Glasgow, Scotland on January 26, 2019, as he and members of his family were returning to the United States from a trip to Europe.

Jack was born Jan 9, 1938, in Richmond, Virginia, to the late John B. Mayo, Sr, and Lillian Mayo (nee Hargrave). Jack's father was in Public Relations and Advertising, and worked for the Railroads. 

Scouting in Tonga:



Tonga is one of 29 countries where Scouting (for boys) exists be it embryonic or widespread, but where there is no National Scout Organization. Scouting is active in Tonga as an overseas branch of The Scout Association (UK), which allows Tonga to act as a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement. The Girl Guides Association of the Kingdom of Tonga is the national Guiding organization of Tonga. Guiding was started at the instigation of Queen Salote in 1952. The girls-only organization became an associate member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts in 1987. The membership badges of both organizations incorporate the crown from the coat of arms of Tonga.

Gambia Takes Scouting to Nursery Schools Targeting 3 to 7 Year Olds

The National Association of Early childhood education of the Gambia invited the Gambia scout association to do a presentation about scouting, its importance and how young people between the Ages of 3-7 years can take part in scouting. Growth is a priority for the Gambia scout Association and a strategy to reach 80% increment in numbers by 2021 is to introduce scouting to schools and communities.
